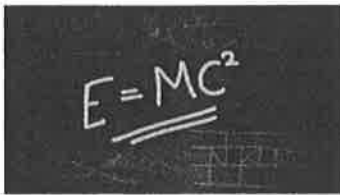
July 9-12

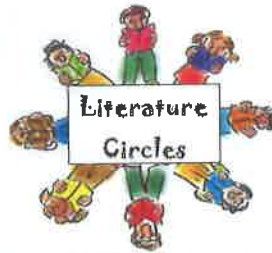
